Personally came before
me the undersigned
Presiding Judge of the Court of Common
Pleas for the Southern District of the State of Ohio
John Babbes who being duly sworn according
to law deposed and said, that some time
in the summer of the year 1776, the precise
date, he cannot now state, he enlisted
for the three years in the service of the
Continental Congress, under Capt. Andrew
Scott (in the town of Annapolis) of the
Smallwood's Regiment of the Maryland
line, that in this Regiment was in the
action on Long Island where the Regi-
ment ofered a severe and sustained
loss, was dispersed and almost broken
up, that in consequence of the great
diminution of the Regiment, in the
action, numbers of the survivors were
induced to engage to serve during
the war, as did this deponent under
Capt. Scott, that subsequently in the
action at White Plains State of New
York Capt. Scott was killed and
Lt. Thomas Barrad of the company was
mortally wounded and he this

deponent has leg badly broken by a piece
or fragment of a rock knocked off by a
Canon Ball, that he was sent after
he received this wound to the Hospital at
Chloris Tower, State of New Jersey, and after
wards to Bethlehem and a place called
Crop Key in the State of Pennsylvania
that this deponent was a long time
confining in the Hospitals aforesaid
and that he never after so far recovered
from the wound and injury received as to
be capable of performing active duty
in the field, that after he had partially
and measurably regained the use of his
leg he acted as orderly sergeant and
attended upon the Hospitals during
the remainder of the war that at the
close of the war, he marched to Annapolis
where he was mustered and discharged
from the Service, that to the best of
his knowledge and recollection his
discharge was signed by Lt. Burges
and Major Puer both officers of the
Chamblaine Line, that several years
afterwards, he this deponent, then
residing in the State of Virginia
had his discharge and Certificate
of right to land for his Service

in the revolutionary war up in the hands
of Francis Keys Esq attorney at law of
Hampshire County in the State of said
for the purpose of having his land located
and title perfected, that the aforesaid
Keys soon after died on his way to
Richmond (Va) and that the Discharge
and Certificate aforesaid, have never
been recovered from him or his heirs
And finally this deponent, deposes
and faith, that in consequence of
his advanced age and disability
he is entirely unable to support him-
self by labour or otherwise, and that
he stands in need of the assistance
of his country for support and
further faith not

ON this 28th day of August 1820 personally appeared in open court, being a court of record for the said County John Datto — aged sixty eight years resident in said County — who, being duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath declare, that he served in the revolutionary war, as follows: that he said John Datto enlisted for the term of three years — in the month of — in the year 1777 in the state of Maryland in the company commanded by Captain Smallwood in the regiment commanded by Colonel Scott in the line of the state of Maryland on the continental establishment. That he continued to serve in the said corps until the day of March 1781 when he was discharged from the said service in Arnold's Company in the state of Maryland that his original declaration was dated on the 30th day of April 1818 that he has received a pension certificate, given at the War Office of the United States on the 25th day of September 1818 which said certificate is numbered 2478 — And in pursuance of the act of the 1st May, 1820, I do solemnly swear that I was a resident citizen of the United States, on the 18th day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighteen, and that I have not, since that time, by gift, sale, or in any manner, disposed of my property, or any part thereof, with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of Congress, entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States, in the Revolutionary War," passed on the 18th day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighteen; and that I have not, nor has any person, in trust for me, any property or securities, contracts, or debts, due to me; nor have I any income other than what is contained in the schedule hereto annexed and by me subscribed. And I further declare under oath that I am by occupation a labourer that I have a wife and family but that my children are all of age situated in hips and capable of taking care of themselves. I am disabled by a wound in the leg which I received in the Revolutionary War for which I have never received a Pension and otherwise afflicted with the rheumatism and bodily pains which render me unable to maintain myself by labour. I now reside with a son of mine and my children have for several years past materially contributed to my support and further I declare not I now to and subscribed in open Court this 28th day of August 1820

Dear Madam:

Reference is made to your letter in which you request the Revolutionary War record of John Babbe(or Babb), who received a pension, died after 1840 and was buried in Ripley County, Indiana.

The data which follow were obtained from the papers on file in Revolutionary War pension claim, S.45341, based upon the military service in that war of John Babbe, the only soldier of that name that is found on the Revolutionary War records of this office.

The date and place of birth and names of the parents of John Babbe are not shown.

John Babbe enlisted in Annapolis, Maryland, in the summer of 1776, served as a private in Captain Scott's Company, Colonel Smallwood's Maryland Regiment, was in the battle on Long Island and battle of White Plains, in which latter engagement his captain was killed and he had his leg broken by a fragment of rock which was broken off by a cannon ball and struck him; he later served in Captain Ford's Company, Colonel Ramsey's 3rd Maryland Regiment, and was discharged at the close of the war. He stated that he served, also, as orderly sergeant and attendant in a hospital while recovering from his injury.

He was allowed pension on his application executed April 30, 1818; said application was executed in Hamilton County, Ohio.

In 1830, he was aged sixty-three years and resided with a son, name not shown, in Hamilton County, Ohio. In same year, soldier referred to his wife and children but gave no names.
