In the name of God Amen

I Hardy Jones of the County of Roane and State of Tennessee being somewhat advanced in age and infirm in body, knowing the uncertainty of life and the certainty of death and in my right mind do wish at my decease that my property may be disposed of in the following manner To wit, I will and bequeath to my wife Elizabeth my negro man George and his wife Mary and sons Eli & George and Nelson a negro man also all my stock household furniture & farm & Jan yard tools & land I now live on and hold in my possession for her use and benefit during her natural life or widelife at the decease of my wife I wish George and Mary to be at liberty to live with any of my children they choose to live with the balance of the negroes to wit Eli & George John and Nelson I wish to be put up at auction and no person be allowed to bid except the heirs of my estate and the money they bring to be equally divided I also wish all my perishable property put up and sold to the highest bidder and divided as the money the negroes was sold for equally amongst my heirs after the payment of all my debts and funeral expenses, I also wish at the decease of my wife my son Rufus to have my land by his relinquishing all his right in all the balance of my estate and in the negro woman Rachel & her children that belongs to my wife and the heirs of her body by his paying of the balance of the heirs twelve hundred dollars in three yearly installments with interest from the time he gets the land in possession I also wish that the children of my son Daniel to have his part and share with the balance of my children in the negro woman Rachel and her children that was give to my wife by her father and if said children is cut out of their interest in said negroes I want them valued and their part they owed out of them negroes to be made up to them before any of the rest gets any, I also wish to Taliaferro Sw. and my wife Elizabeth to be executors of the above
